Good afternoon Jade,

Apologies for my delay in responding to your email, I have had to collate the information from the relevant different teams in order to provide answers to each of your queries. Please find these answers below:

- [Who has requested the cameras be installed and what is the full administrative cost for the County Council/Via EM to install, monitor, maintain and remove these cameras? Also to collate and report on the information.](#)
 - The request for a traffic survey was made by the safer Highways team at Via EM who are the County Council's Highways delivery partners. These surveys are standard for the development of any proposed scheme that are included in a works programme. Surveys allow us to understand the existing conditions, to gather evidence that is needed to evaluate if a scheme is required, assess potential impacts so that all effects on current traffic are fully considered, and to inform value for money consideration before we proceed. The total administrative cost for this survey exercise is £2,158.00 which includes survey arrangement, installation and removal of the survey equipment, processing of the data and video footage, and to collate and report the results.
- [What are the dates from/ to that you are monitoring? Note that some schools will break up for 3 weeks tomorrow so this will be a futile exercise and will not be a true reflection of traffic and risks.](#)
 - The footage was recorded over three days (Tue 9th-Thu 11th Dec) so data collection was completed before any schools broke up on Friday 12th December (the last day of term for public schools in Nottinghamshire being Friday 19th December). Although three days of footage was collected, only one day will be processed. There is a permanent traffic counter located on A60 Church Street, which has been used to validate the data collected by the camera surveys. The data from the permanent counter shows that both Wednesday 10th & Thursday 11th December are representative of typical traffic volumes over a longer period. The volume on Tuesday 9th December was slightly lower than average so this will not be used. The data from Thursday 11th was chosen to be processed which will include the traffic turning counts, and pedestrian and cyclists crossing the junction.

 - The data gathered includes vehicles, pedestrians, and cycle movements.
- [What are you going to do with this data and will it have any impact on the decision?](#)
 - The data will be used to model the impact of closing Burns Lane to vehicular traffic on the surrounding network. The output from the modelling will be provided to Nottinghamshire County Council and form part of the report to the Cabinet Member for their consideration.
- [When will we hear back an official comment on the current status and next steps? Residents are keen to hear updates.](#)
 - Currently, Via EM are undertaking the modelling of the traffic data, this is expected to be completed by the end of January. Following this, the report to the Cabinet Member will be completed and issued to NCC for consideration.

Following on from the phone call just now, regarding the cameras put up and the email we have received from a resident (pasted in below) - You have confirmed to me that the cameras are indeed regarding the potential closure of Burns Lane and are to monitor traffic. I would like to thank you for following this up and for calling me back so quickly, you have been very helpful. As i have emphasised to you, there has been massive objection from the community regarding this closure, so I need to get the facts to respond to them and address any speculation. Please note that any information you give to me will be shared with Parish Councillors and to the community who are asking for updates. It will also be copied to the Member of Parliament for Mansfield, who has also been collating data on the resident's views regarding the closure.

A few questions please:

1. Who has requested the cameras be installed and what is the full administrative cost for the County Council/Via EM to install, monitor, maintain and remove these cameras? Also to collate and report on the information.
2. What are the dates from/ to that you are monitoring? Note that some schools will break up for 3 weeks tomorrow so this will be a futile exercise and will not be a true reflection of traffic and risks.

4. What are you going to do with this data and will it have any impact on the decision?
5. When will we hear back an official comment on the current status and next steps? Residents are keen to hear updates.

Email received:

I'm forwarding you an email I sent to Steve Yemm last night regarding the traffic monitoring cameras we've noticed on Hetts Lane and at the entry to the back lane opposite Nethercross Drive.

My assumption is that this is part of the process re the closure of the lane but it could be for another reason, however as mentioned in my email below 2 of the local schools break up this Friday and the rest the following week for 2 weeks. I'm therefore concerned that the true traffic flow picture won't be represented during this period of time.

I'm not sure if there is any way to find out if it is for this reason and also raise concerns about the timing of it?

Would you let me know what you think about it please or if you've been made aware of it through the Parish Council.
