# Warsop Parish Council Launch

## Grassroots Community Grants



## £4,500 AVAILABLE FOR LOCAL COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Community groups, organisations and clubs are being encouraged to apply for a share of £4,500 as Warsop Parish Council launches the first round of its new Grassroots Community Grants scheme.

The funding has been made available through the **East Midlands Mayor's Community Development Fund**, with Market Warsop ward selected by Mayor Claire Ward as one of just ten priority areas across the region.

The new grant scheme will provide £9,000 per year for three years to support projects that make a positive difference in the local community. Grants can be used to help bring people together, improve wellbeing, strengthen community life, or enhance the local area.

The first funding round opens this month, with grants of up to £1,500 available for eligible projects that benefit residents of the Market Warsop ward. Groups and organisations based outside the ward may also apply if they can demonstrate a clear benefit to local residents.

Applications must be submitted by **Friday 4th September 2026**, with funding decisions due to be made by the Grassroots Grants Panel on **Thursday 17th September 2026**.

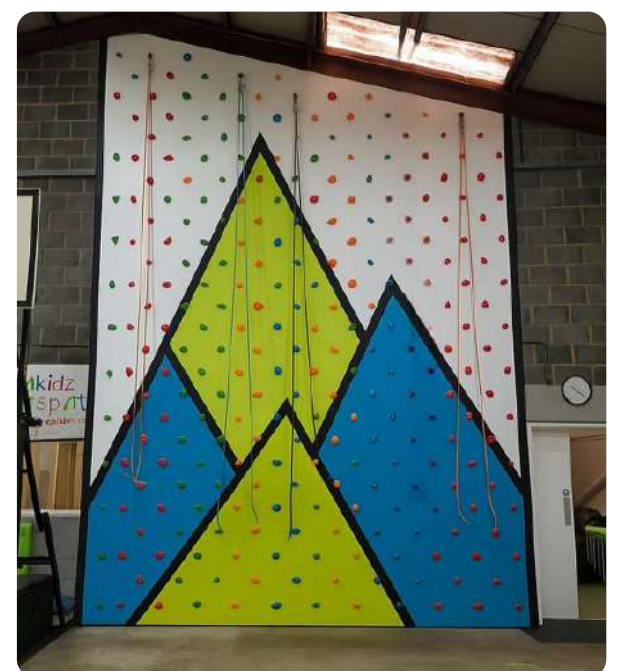

## Your Safer Neighbourhoods Team

PCSO Laura Morris has recently joined the Safer Neighbourhoods Team.

The team remains aware of ongoing concerns regarding the use of off-road bikes within the community. As part of ongoing enforcement activity, two off-road bikes were recently seized. An operation to tackle this issue is continuing, and the team has recently taken delivery of two quad bikes and an off-road vehicle to improve access to difficult terrain and support enforcement efforts.

The team hold regular beat surgeries across the area, providing residents with an opportunity to discuss local concerns and receive updates on policing issues. Details of upcoming surgeries will be advertised on social media.

## Burns Lane Proposed Closure - Petition Launched

**We have still not received any updates from Nottinghamshire County Council (and the designer) about the proposed closure of Burns Lane.**

The Parish Council believes residents deserve to be properly informed and consulted on any proposals that could significantly affect travel, access, and connectivity within our community.

In the absence of meaningful engagement, we are asking residents to make their views known by signing a petition a resident has launched. We understand that many of you have already objected to Stages 1 and 2 of the Consultation. However, this petition will be sent to the County Councillor, who will then present this to Full Council at Nottinghamshire.

If you object to this proposed closure, the petition is available to sign at the following locations until **midday 21st September 2026**.

## Town Hall Transformation Begins

**Preparatory work has begun inside the former Town Hall building in Warsop as the project moves steadily toward a major phase of redevelopment planned over the summer.** The building, which was asset transferred for community use, is now the focus of a significant investment by Lifespring Church, who are funding the work through raised funds and funding grants, giving financial commitment to ensure the space can be restored and fully reopened for the benefit of local residents.

Over recent months, smaller internal projects have already taken place, including early clearance, removal of outdated fixtures, and initial preparation. These first steps have begun to reveal the potential of the building as it moves toward full redevelopment.

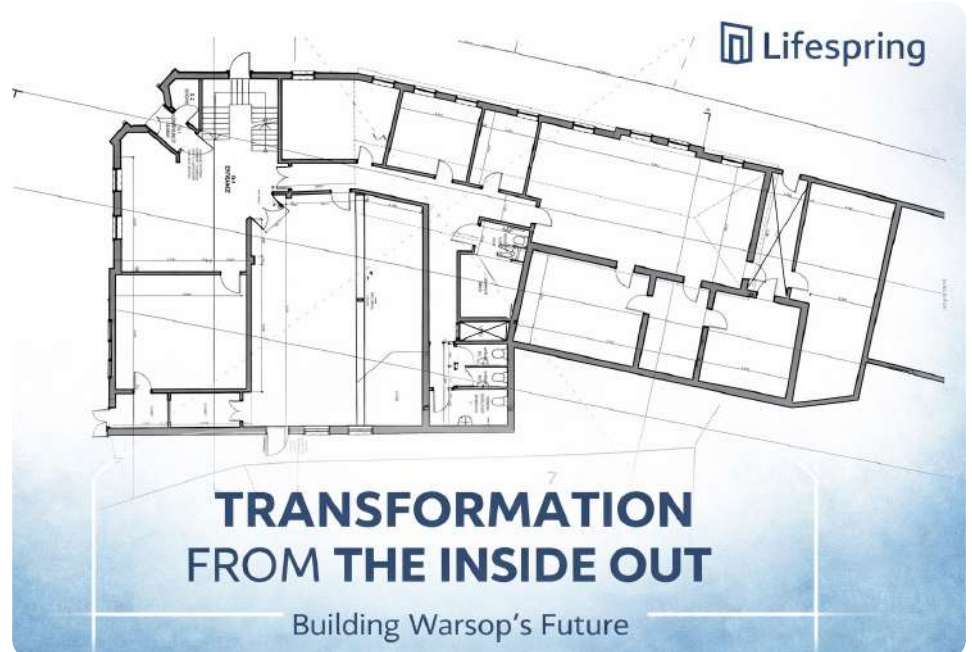
### Summer: The Start of Major Internal Work

During the summer, contractors will begin the main phase of internal transformation. This will include:

- Removing some internal walls to open up unusable areas
- Rebuilding key sections to improve safety and accessibility
- Creating brighter, lighter rooms suitable for community use
- Introducing step-free routes and wider access points
- Modernising infrastructure to make the building warm, efficient, and future-ready

**Following a proven model from Ollerton:** Lifespring’s decision to invest heavily in Warsop is shaped by its experience in Ollerton, where the church transformed an older building that didn’t have the space or facilities the community needed. Through redevelopment and thoughtful design, that site has grown into a vibrant community hub, now providing a variety of community events across all generations and community needs. The intention is to replicate those principles in Warsop, creating a space that is modern, inclusive, and designed around the needs of local people.

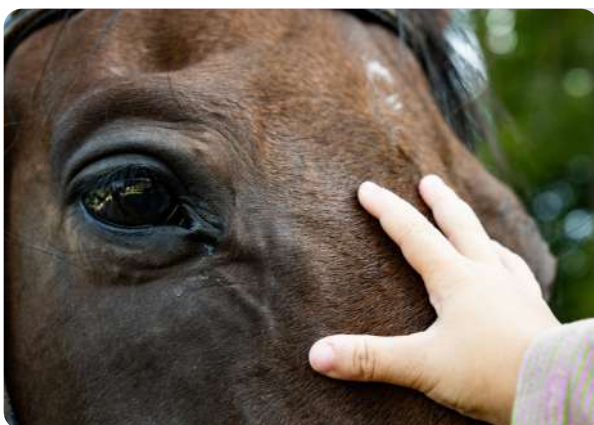


*Blueprints for the development of Lifespring*

**A Long-Term Commitment to the Community:** Lifespring has emphasised that the project is about restoring a central community asset and ensuring it remains available for residents, groups, and local initiatives. The church’s willingness to invest funding and staffing reflects a long-term commitment to the town and confidence in the building’s potential to serve Warsop for many years to come.

**Visible Progress and Growing Anticipation:** As smaller projects continue and the summer redevelopment approaches, anticipation is growing among residents who have long hoped to see the building revitalised. The transformation is now moving from planning to visible action, with the first signs of change already taking shape.

**With work set to begin soon, the redevelopment stands as a positive step for Warsop, an investment in community life, shared spaces, and the future of the town.**

## School Debate Teams in Session

In July, Warsop Parish Council will be launching its School Debate Team initiative, giving local schoolchildren the opportunity to experience democracy in action. Junior school pupils will be invited to the Council Chambers to take part in a mock council debate, discussing real issues affecting the local community.

Sherwood and Birklands School will be the first to participate, with pupils sharing their views as part of a Market Warsop ward consultation on Swallows Green.

This consultation relates to the East Midlands Mayor’s Community Development Funding for the new park. The debate session will give children the chance to put forward ideas, debate different perspectives, and gain an insight into how councillors discuss and make decisions on matters that affect local residents. Eastlands, Church Vale and Meden School will be invited to attend a session after the Summer holidays.

Exploring the Nature That Makes Warsop Special



Help Nature, Cut the Chemicals

Dukeries Eco Watch

Thousands of toxic chemicals are in routine use, on farmers' fields, in our homes and gardens, and in the products we buy. One way we can all help to protect nature and ourselves is by cutting the chemicals whenever we can.

1. Avoid "Forever Chemicals" (PFAS). PFAs do not break down naturally, so build up toxicity in our bodies and the environment.

2. Avoid laundry products that warn of being toxic or "harmful to aquatic life".

3. Choose non-aerosol and low Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) products. VOCs are harmful gases released from many everyday products, including aerosol sprays, paints, cleaning products, air fresheners, building materials, and garden chemicals. These emissions can negatively affect air quality and may pose health risks to people, as well as harm plants and crops.

4. Opt for organic food whenever possible. Living with fewer chemicals is better for our health and for our planet.

5. Avoid garden pesticides and plastic grass. Pesticides poison target "pests", all creatures along that food chain and the soil. Plastic grass reduces biodiversity. Often containing PFAS, it breaks down into microplastics, permanently polluting soil and water systems.

Warsop Wildlife Team: How You Can Help Wildlife This Summer

As spring turns to summer, we're urging the public to take note of our latest contact information to ensure injured, orphaned, or distressed wildlife can receive help as quickly as possible.

The warmer months are our busiest time of year. Wildlife is actively breeding, nesting, and raising young. However, while many people act with the very best intentions, not every young animal found alone actually needs rescuing.

If you are unsure whether an animal genuinely needs help, don't panic or immediately remove it from the wild. Taking a quick photo and contacting the team can help us give the right advice and ensure wildlife receives the best outcome. There are several simple ways everyone can all support local wildlife:

Leave shallow water dishes out for birds, hedgehogs, and pollinators during hot weather. Add in stones so insects can safely climb out.

Check grass before mowing, hedgehogs and nesting wildlife are often hidden in long grass.

Avoid disturbing nests and dens, even if they appear unattended.

Create wildlife-friendly gardens by allowing small wild patches, planting pollinator-friendly flowers, and leaving access points for hedgehogs.

Warsop Footpaths & Countryside Group

"There were promising results from our water vole survey that we completed in May".

Each year we walk along the River Meden between the Mill Dam and Stone Bridge looking for evidence of water vole activity - faeces, burrows, runs and chewed grass. This time we found evidence suggesting there are at least four territories with pleasing signs of recovery in the section between the BMX track and the bridge at the end of Stonebridge Lane.

A less welcome feature along our riverbanks are Himalayan balsam plants. We continue to try to keep parts of the parish clear of this invasive species. If you are lucky enough to have a water-side garden please make sure that you pull up all balsam plants before their seed pods explode.

By now our volunteers should be well into our programme of mowing along fifteen of Warsop's public footpaths and bridleways. We go out once a week, usually on Thursday mornings. Get in touch if you are interested in joining us. Or you can help keep the grass in check by regularly walking along these paths!

The weekend of 25th and 26th July sees the return of the Sherwood Forest Trust Woodland Festival at Thoresby Park. It brings together local makers, woodland crafts, family activities, nature talks and much more. Well worth a visit.

It will be a steady walk with regular stops to look at features in the forest. Bring drinks and snacks, wear suitable footwear and come ready for the weather. As part of the Mansfield District Council Career Ambassador programme, we recently supported Yeoman Park SEND school in Mansfield Woodhouse and arranged a visit to the Warsop Health Hub.

The students have recently been learning about health and fitness and the school approached us to see if we could help. Working in partnership with Serco, we arranged a visit over two mornings to the hub for a small group of students. During their visit they had a tour of the building, met some of the team, learned about the pool maintenance and testing and set up activities in the main hall – and then had a go at badminton!

Lauren from the centre did an amazing job – she explained her role and the day to day activity that takes place in the busy hub, talked about the role of a lifeguard and also showed the students the maintenance room which was fascinating! She even took time out of her busy day to demonstrate some first aid skills including CPR and we bandaged each other up!

We then introduced life skills into the session and ambassadors talked about the different roles and careers within a leisure centre setting and the students participated in an activity to manage a staffing budget.

### What is going on down on Portland Street?

Residents and local groups have envisaged and planned a community garden on this site. Bowring Transport had the foresight to provide the land for the garden, rather than building houses.

The garden has been developed over the past two years with volunteers sharing their time and skills, with support from co-ordinator Caroline Hughes.



Caroline said, 'we wanted to create a positive space where people can gain confidence in gardening for wildlife, as well as create a lovely space to keep us all blooming!'



Our combined effort has already attracted butterflies, bees and gold finches. It takes time and patience though, and we have some amazing volunteers who give incredible support, from experienced gardeners, cubs and scouts and their parents, not forgetting our amazing ninja gardener Pat, who you may see buzzing around Warsop on her mobility scooter, as she tends to plants in public areas.'

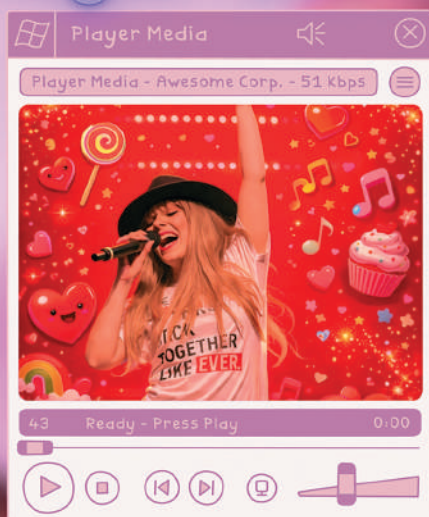

## Remembering Debra Barlow

Earlier this year, Warsop Parish lost one of its most passionate advocates with the death of Debra Barlow.

Born in Warsop Parish, Debra's connection to the area ran throughout her life. Although her nursing career took her abroad, her love for the community she called home never faded. She returned with the same determination and sense of purpose that would later define her contribution to local life.

Debra served as a Parish Councillor from 2016 until her death, including two years as Chair, and as a District Councillor from 2019 to 2023. She approached both roles with energy, commitment and a genuine desire to improve the lives of local residents. Many will remember her as a founder member of Let Warsop Speak, where she played a leading role in opposing the Stonebridge development.

Debra helped form the Swallows Green community group, where she worked alongside local residents to help raise funds to improve the field. She was also a passionate ambassador for the transplant service, using her experiences to raise awareness and support others.

Debra was forthright, determined and never afraid to speak truth to power. Whether people agreed with her or not, nobody doubted her sincerity or her commitment to the causes she believed in. She cared deeply about Warsop Parish and fought tirelessly for the people she represented.

Those who knew Debra will remember more than the positions she held. They will remember her warmth, her humour, her strength of character and her willingness to stand up for what she believed was right. Her contribution to Warsop Parish will not be forgotten, and her legacy lives on in the community she loved and worked so hard to serve.

Natalie proved to be an enthusiastic and dedicated member of the team, embracing every opportunity to learn from parish councillors, office staff and the wider team. Here's what she had to say about her experience.**

"The Parish Council have offered a wealth of valuable advice during my placement. Between the powers of a delegated authority, the various committee authorities, and their role within the wider community.

I was able to sit in on the annual meetings of both the Parish and the Parish Council, where the chair and vice chair were appointed, Parish functions were discussed, and future plans were put in place. I also learned how the Parish operates as a pressure group, voicing the needs of the local area and ensuring Warsop is properly represented. As an aspiring lawyer, the insight on the power of the Council and their application of statute in day-to-day life was very interesting as it made clear the link between the law and society.

Furthermore, the behind the scenes view into a detailed events safety management guide for a large event, adhering to Martyn's Law and ensuring safety for all, showed me how events preparation links closely with the law.

The week also entailed preparing meeting agendas and minutes and a look in to the many internal controls and statutory requirements of a local authority, such as the signing of the annual governance and accountability return.

I was also able to read historic issues of the Warsop Parish Newspaper, an interesting look at Warsop through time, and talk to a member of the Citizens Advice Bureau who offer essential services to give advice those who need support.

My favourite part of the week was when I designed a grant proposal for a small project, which provided another key example of council functions and the steps taken to provide the local area with support and funding to thrive".

8oz Plain Flour

2oz Margarine

2oz Lard

or

4oz Vegetable Fat

1/4 level teaspoon Salt

Cold water to mix

### Filling

1lb Rhubarb

2oz Sugar approx (or to taste)

Cooking Tin 7" x 11" x 1 1/4"

approx

### Topping

2oz Good Quality Margarine

2oz Castor Sugar

Eggs

2oz S.R. Flour

few drops Almond Essence

### METHOD

Prepare rhubarb, cut into short lengths.

Make shortcrust pastry, roll to shape, line cooking tin, fit well.

Arrange rhubarb in pastry case, sprinkle with sugar.

Cream together margarine and castor sugar until light and fluffy.

Add slightly beaten egg by degrees, beat well between each addition to avoid curdling, add almond essence.

Fold in sifted flour, spread creamed mixture over rhubarb.

Roll out pastry trimmings, cut into strips for lattice, arrange over topping, seal ends well to pastry case.

Bake in a moderately hot oven, regulate 4, 350°F, 180°C, 25

to 30 mins approx, reduce if necessary after initial cooking.
